Walna Scar Parking GPS 54.36098 -3.17142 GridRef 239968


Approach up the Seathwaite reservoir track to the second gate (about 20 minutes, steady pacing to a funeral march, 75 bpm)

From the second gate crags A + E are visible.

 $B\ C+D$ are visible from further up the track but are over the skyline from the gate. Walk up on the left of the wall for A+E.

Easiest route to B C + D is by traversing below A then heading up and across the hillside.

First ascent of all routes -M Bagness - solo - 5.06.2021



Horse How Crag D

1 The Corner HS † New 14m

Hand traverse right from blocks and climb the corner.

2 Left Slab E2 5b † New 14m

After a steep start, cross *The Corner*, and up the slab. No protection!

- 3 Evil Cleft HS † New 14m
- Purple Slab E1 5b † New 14m

Climb the slab, with some gear, but escapable.





Climb pebble-dash carefully to the break (gear) then nice moves just right of the arête.





Gain and climb the corner.
